History & Mission:



Intro for What We Believe:

Before we jump into the doctrine of the church, allow me to clarify something. One of the
foundational truths from this church's past (and all Independent Christian churches) that I
believe is very relevant in today's religiously-broad world is this: "We are not the
Christians; we are Christians only." This means that we must approach the different faith
backgrounds of other believers with humility; recognizing that we have had different influences
that have shaped our beliefs. The people who worship here come from all walks of life and
religious backgrounds. Although our beliefs may be, they SHOULD NOT make us
divisive. We value the faith experiences of each person here and we are committed to the
unity of all believers. Regardless of our faith background, we share one name: Christian! And
that is something I believe should be celebrated! We all can unite under the same banner, the
same umbrella, which is Jesus Christ. "We are not the only Christians; we are Christians only."
Also, we should never think we have all the answers I definitely do not! What we must use as
our only guide is Scripture. That's why we preach Jesus and Jesus only. All of our teachings and
beliefs can be backed with Scripture. It is the job of every believer to speak the truth in love
(Ephesians 4:14-15). So this is something I do passionately and unashamedly.

What We Believe:
The : We believe that the Bible is the inspired Word of God, the written record of His
supernatural revelation of Himself to man, absolute in its authority, complete in its revelation,
final in its content and without any error in its teaching and is "living and active" ever speaking
to our present circumstances. (Hebrews 4:12, 2 Timothy 3:16-17; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Psalm
119:160)
: God is the creator and ruler of the universe. He eternally exists in three persons: the
Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. These three are co-equal and therefore, are one
God. (Genesis 1:1, Genesis 1:26-27; Psalm 90:2; John 1:1-3; John 1:14; Acts 5:3-4)
: Jesus Christ is the Son of God, yet He is co-equal with the Father and the Holy Spirit.
Jesus lived a sinless life and offered himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all people by
dying on the cross. He arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin
and death. He ascended to heaven's glory and one day will return to earth to reign as King of
Kings and Lord of Lords. (John 1:1-5; Matthew 16:16-17; John 3:16; Acts 1:10-11; 1 Corinthians
15:3-4)
The Spirit: The Holy Spirit is equal with the Father and Jesus as God. He is present in
the world to make us aware of our need for Jesus Christ. He lives in every believer from the
moment of salvation. He provides Christians with power for living, understanding of spiritual
truth, guidance to do what is right, and gifts to use in ministry. We seek to live under His
direction daily. (John 14:26: John 16:7-14: Ephesians 1:13-14: Acts 1:8: Galatians 5:22-25)



: The New Testament teaches that when a person puts his faith in Jesus, that process is culminated by immersion in water as a public testimony of that decision. The act of baptism alone *cannot* save a person, however, it is an essential part of a *process*. In other words, God intended baptism to be part of how a person puts his faith in Jesus. We aren't making a theological argument about the exact moment that a person is saved. Instead, we teach that after the resurrection of Jesus, there is no concept in the New Testament of an unbaptized believer. We understand that there are people from other traditions who have confessed their faith in Jesus as Lord and Savior, but were baptized as an infant, before they had faith. There are also other believers who confessed their faith in Jesus but were simply never taught the New Testament teaching of baptism. In these cases, we teach people to fulfill the teaching of the New Testament by being baptized (immersed) as a believing adult. We also require all unbaptized believers to be baptized before becoming a member of Northside Christian Church. (Romans 5:1-2, Luke 24:45-47, Acts 3:19, 17:30, 2 Peter 3:9, Matthew 10:32, Romans 10:9, Philippians 2:11, 1 John 4:15, Acts 2:38, Romans 6:1-7, Galatians 3:27, Colossians 2:12, 1 Peter 3:21)

The Holy _____: We believe that those who receive Christ also receive the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit: He marks them as the possession of God, manifests the fruit of righteousness in their character, and endows them with spiritual gifts for ministry. (2 Corinthians 1:21-22, Galatians 5:22-23, 1 Corinthians 12:4-6) We believe that a spiritual gift is a special ability, given by the Holy Spirit to every believer, to be used to minister to others and thereby build up the Body of Christ (1 Peter 4:10, Romans 12:6-8, 1 Corinthians 12:7-11)

- a. We believe that through the Holy Spirit God supernaturally intervenes in life by healing and other miraculous interventions.
- b. Regarding the miraculous gifts of speaking in tongues, interpreting tongues, and the spiritual gift of healing by one's own will: We believe that in New Testament churches which lacked direct apostolic leadership, these specific miraculous gifts were not present because in the New Testament they are only given by the laying on of the Apostle's hands. Therefore, we do not expect to see spiritual gifts such as speech in tongues and healing by one's own will as a normative gift in the church today. (Acts 8:5-8, 14-17, Acts 19:1-7)
- c. Since we do not believe these specific "miraculous" gifts are normative in the church today, we ask that those who seek to exercise these specific spiritual gifts (e.g. speaking in tongues) not practice them within our worship services nor promote the exercise of them among our members. (1 Corinthians 13:8-10)

Sanctity of _____: We believe that all human life is sacred and created by God in His image. Luke shares this in Acts 2:42-47, "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴³ Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴ All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵ They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. ⁴⁶ Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."

How To Read And Understand The Bible

Pastor Robby Gallaty shares this helpful journaling tool that we can use to understand the Bible and better H.E.A.R. from God.

- ➤ **Highlight** After reading the passage of Scripture, HIGHLIGHT each verse that speaks to you by copying it under the letter "H".
- Explain After you highlight the passage, then EXPLAIN what the text means. Questions to help you answer are: "Why was this written?" "To whom was it originally written?" "How does it fit with the verses before and after it?" "Why did the Holy Spirit include this passage in the book?" "What is He intending to communicate through this text?"
- ➤ Apply Next, figure out how this will APPLY to your life personally. Ask a series of questions to uncover the significance of the passage to you. Questions like: "How can this help me?" "What does this mean today?" "What would the application of this verse look like in my life?" "What is God saying to me?"
- ➤ **Respond** Finally, decide to RESPOND to what you've just read. Your response may take on many forms such as writing a call to action plan and then doing it, writing out a prayer to God, calling someone you need to forgive, talking with your spouse about how you interact or parent, deciding to reevaluate your budget to see where you can give more back to God.

Sample H.E.A.R. Entry

Read: Philippians 4:10-13 Date: 2-22-20 Title: Secret of Contentment (H) Highlight – "I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength." – Philippians 4:13

- (E) Explain Paul was telling the church at Philippi that he has discovered the secret of contentment. No matter the situation, he realized that Christ was all he needed, and Christ was the one who strengthened him to persevere through difficult times.
- (A) Apply In my life, I will experience many ups and downs. My contentment is not found in circumstances. Rather, it is based on my relationship with Jesus. Only Jesus gives me the strength I need to be content in every circumstance of life.
- (R) Respond Jesus, please help me as I strive to be content in You and You only. Through Your strength, I can make it through all situations I face in this life. Amen.

Purpose: The purpose of small groups is to provide a safe environment where participants pursue authentic relationships, grow spiritually and become disciple-making disciples. Small groups are where we believe life-change happens. Men's, women's single's and co-ed groups meet both at Northside and in homes throughout the surrounding community all week long.

Essentials:

- **Stay Connected** While prayer and discussion of curriculum are key elements, the main emphasis of this group is the building of relationships to foster a connection with Jesus and each other.
- Provide Care Group members will choose to be fully present and provide care and support for one another.
- **Promote** _____ Group members will make involvement a priority and encourage others to participate consistently in meetings, projects and socials.
- Actively Serve Group members will make efforts to serve the community on a regular basis by being the hands, feet and mouth of Jesus.
- **Have Fun** Christianity isn't boring... small groups aren't either. Group members will choose to participate in social, fun outings to help cultivate relationships.
- Intentionally ______ At the end of our season, we agree to form new small groups. This action does not end our friendships, it gives us the opportunity to make and multiply other disciples for Jesus.

Guidelines:

- **Authenticity**: This environment encourages openness and transparency among members. Group members should feel free to be themselves.
- **Confidentiality**: For authenticity to occur, members must be able to trust that issues discussed within the group will not be shared outside of the group.
- Everyone is given the right to their opinion, and questions are encouraged and respected. Group members should never say anything that will embarrass their spouses or other members of the group.
- **Accountability**: We agree to let members hold us accountable to the commitments we make, individually or as a group.

Why should I join a small group?

- Your group discussions will ______ your understanding of the Bible: In a small group you can ask questions, interact with others and learn how the ideas and principles contained in the Word of God apply to your life.
- You will feel more connected to God's family: It can be easy to get lost in a large church, but a small group can help you build close relationships with others.
- **Prayer will become more meaningful to you**: Praying with and for the members of your small group will help you to better appreciate the power of prayer and challenge you to have regular conversations with God.
- When _____ comes, you'll have someone to lean on: Crisis and change are an inevitable part of life that bring pressure and stress. Your small group will provide a support system to help you weather life's storms.

How do I find a group?

- On Sunday mornings a variety of classes are offered. While these are not small groups, they do allow you to study and fellowship with other believers. You can just attend the class you are interested in. No sign-up is required. You are always welcome!
- You can sign up on Sunday morning at the Connection Point area in the lobby. You will
 find a Connection Kiosk to register and helpful volunteers to assist you.

Giving:

Those who attend Northside are encouraged to be ______ givers. That means we should be intentionally giving of our time, talents and treasures. God cares about all three areas of our life, not just our treasures (money). The leadership at Northside believes that giving is an act of worship. Therefore, we strive to help those who worship here understand that when we speak about and teach on giving, it is not simply transactional... giving is ______. We do not ask you to be an intentional giver because of what we want *from* you. Instead, it's because of what we want *for* you. We want to see you grow spiritually, eliminate debt and thrive financially! Here are a few ways you can become an intentional giver:

- **Commit to** _____ giving: Decide to give to God before you spend money anywhere else. Making giving a priority is a sure sign of spiritual growth. Even if you can't give 10% right now, start giving something.
 - o 10% is a tithe as taught in the Old Testament
 - The New Testament Christian should use 10% as their starting point
 - O What is an offering as described in the N.T.?
 - **Given Freely:** Matthew 10:8 "Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received, freely give."
 - **Given Regularly:** 1 Corinthians 16:2 "On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income, saving it up, so that when I come so no collections will have to be made."
 - **Given Cheerfully:** 2 Corinthians 9:7 "Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."
 - **Given Sacrificially:** Acts 2:44-45 "All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need."

- Live by the ____-__ rule: Save 10% of your income; Tithe 10% to your church; and live on 80% of your income. This is hard to practice.
 "When God blesses you financially, don't raise your standard of living. Raise your
- God loves a cheerful giver. When He sees that someone is giving freely out of love and joy, it makes Him happy! When God sees us cling to the blessings He gives, it breaks His heart. Here's something you already know: Americans are the richest people in the world. Because of our resources, we also have a greater ______. Think about it... If we've been blessed more than the rest of the world, would it stand to reason that God wants us to care more about the rest of the world? The answer is yes. Because God has blessed us generously (with our resources), we should be giving generously to others.

Could you imagine the power of your testimony, if as a Christian, you were radically generous? We can become radically generous only when we become intentional with the wealth God has blessed us with. Here are stats about American generosity today and what it could look like if we were radically generous. (healthresearchfunding.org, ChurchLeaders.com - May 2011)

• Only 5% of Americans tithe (give 10% or more of their income)

standard of ______." (Pastor and author Mark Batterson)

- 80% of Americans give only 2.5% of their income to churches/non-profits
- Anywhere from 33-50% of church-goers give nothing at all.
- If American Christians increased overall giving from 2.5% to 10%, then an extra \$165
 would become available <u>every year</u> for ministry!

Here's what that extra \$165 billion could do:

- \$25 billion would relieve global hunger, starvation, and deaths from all preventable diseases in 5 years AND
- \$12 billion would eliminate illiteracy in 5 years AND
- \$15 billion would solve all the world's water and sanitation issues AND
- \$1 billion would fully fund the Great Commission AND
- \$112 billion would still be left over EACH YEAR for additional ministry expansion.

The point is this: If we decided to give generously out of what God has generously blessed us with, American Christians could literally change the world. Luke 12:48, "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked."

Northside Connect – Week 3

Gifts:

Today we will wrap up this class by discussing what it means to practically Serve Others and Win One. The one G that directly relates to serving others is gifts. Specifically, we mean gifts. At least one spiritual gift is given to every believer at the time of their conversion. Many Christians have multiple gifts. 1 Corinthians 12:7, "Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good."

As a worshipper at Northside, we challenge everyone (youth and adults) to glorify God and further His Kingdom by sacrificially serving the local church and community. We should sacrificially serve by giving of our time, talents and treasure. Last week we talked about the treasure piece (giving). Today, lets dive more into your time and talents.

Each of us has the same amount of time – 24 hours a day, 168 hours a week, 8,760 hours a year. What we do with that time is up to us. I always say: "You make time for what ______ most." Whatever is important to you is what you spend time doing. Our desire is that you spend at least three of your 168 hours each week worshipping, studying and serving (one hour each). Do you think you can start giving God just 3 hours of your week? If you're already giving that much, can you give more?

In addition to time, God has also given us talents – which boil down to two things: _____ physical abilities and spiritual gifts. The natural abilities are things that come easy to us. It may be physical athleticism, it could be that we are great with numbers, words, musical talents, artistic, etc. A great Biblical illustration of this is Bezalel & Oholiab (Exodus 31:2-6) whom God gave the skill, ability and knowledge to build His Tabernacle.

Matthew 25:14-21 & 28-29 helps make it clear that it is God who gives us all kinds of skill, ability and knowledge to accomplish His purpose. He supplies the raw material, it's up to us to train, sharpen and apply ourselves in using our abilities for His glory. Ultimately, we get our S.H.A.P.E. from Him. Our S.H.A.P.E. is the sum total of our:

- **Spiritual Gifts** All believers have been given at least one God-ordained gift that should be used in service and outreach to make disciples.
- ———— All of us have had different experiences, and God has a plan to use our personal history to mold us into the service He needs us to be.
- **Abilities** All of us have natural-born abilities. Some of us are musical, artistic, organizers and others of us are more athletic than creative. We are all different.
- Some of us are introverts and to stand up and do any kind of public speaking would scare us to death! Others of us are extroverts and have no trouble doing what I am doing now. Others of us think things through very carefully before making a decision. Others of us are gut-level persons who are ready to act on a moment's notice.

• Enthusiasm – another word is passion. Jesus declares in Matthew 6:21 that "For where your treasure is, there your heart will also be." Our passions are our treasures and where our thoughts constantly return to each and every spare moment we have. God can and will use what we get enthusiastic about (our passions) in service for His Kingdom.

Each category is a tool, a God-given blessing that He uses to lead us to a place of ministry and service so that others might find Christ and do the same thing. In order to figure out our best fit serving at Northside, it's critical for us to discover our S.H.A.P.E. It's important to note that everyone doesn't fit into the same mold. At Northside, we don't zero in on what you're not good at. We want to focus on your strengths. We believe, "Everyone is a '10' in some area." If you're in an area that's not working out (causing stress) it doesn't mean you're the wrong person, it may mean you're serving in the wrong place. (1 Cor. 12:6).

One of the most common ______ people give for not getting involved in service is "I just don't' have anything to offer." Nothing could be further from the truth! The key is matching your abilities and spiritual gifts with the right ministry! So let's figure out our spiritual gifts now.

 - ii) Ability to hold the interest of those being taught
 - iii) Desire to explain Bible principles to others
- c) Cautions:
 - i) Interest in head knowledge to the neglect of heart response
 - ii) Concerned with content rather than the learner
 - iii) Think of one's self more highly than one should

• Wisdom – Solomon

- a) The ability to regulate one's relationship with God by being able to apply God's truth to an immediate problem or need and help others do the same. (I Corinthians 12:8)
- b) Characteristics:
 - i) Knows how to get to the heart of a problem quickly
 - ii) Thinks practically—is a problem solver
 - iii) Later analysis and evaluation confirms intuitive solutions suggested
- c) Cautions:
 - i) Because of accurate self-images, may be impatient or judgmental with others
 - ii) Tendency to be non-social
 - iii) May be harsh with those who don't see things as you do

 - Example Those with mercy run into everyone else expecting others to have the same amount of mercy.
- 2. Don't feel my gift makes me ______ to others.
 - I Corinthians 12:21
- 3. Realize that using my gifts without is worthless!
 - I Corinthians 13:1-3 (Sandwiched between chapters 12 and 14 which both talk about Spiritual Gifts)
- 4. Recognize that I have both a Primary and a Secondary ministry in my church:
 - Primary Ministry commitment should be in the area where I am
 - My Secondary Ministry includes serving in any other area of the Body when I am
 - Romans 12:1-2; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20

If we truly want to know God's purpose for our lives, then we need to offer ourselves as living sacrifices by living out our Divinely inspired S.H.A.P.E. The more we obey & serve God, the more in tune with His good, pleasing & perfect will we become. That's what gives our lives real joy as we live out what we were created for. This is what it looks like to practically serve others.

Grace:

We will finish up our time discussing what it means to practically Win One. The one G that directly relates to winning one is grace. As we mentioned in week 1, Northside desires to be a church that is known as a place where people both receive and give grace. People can receive grace from us when we accept them as they are, just as Jesus did with the lost. He loved them unconditionally, accepted them as they were, then challenged them to follow Him. He did this in truth and love. We always want to speak the truth in love as well. An old phrase to sum this action up is "Love the sinner, hate the sin." To love the sinner, we must be willing to engage in a relationship with them. This is initiated by extending grace.

One way people can give grace to others is by	to them. Witnessing is simply sharing
the Gospel the Good News about Jesus and what He ha	s done in your life. This is also called
evangelism. This fits in directly with our mission stateme	nt: Love God, Serve Others, Win One.

Why should we win one?

- Because Jesus _____ us to! (Acts 1:7-8; Matthew 28:18-20; Matthew 4:19)
- 2 Corinthians 5:20 "We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us." An ambassador is an official representative of the highest rank, accredited by one government to another. We are Heaven's ambassadors to Earth. Our job is to share Jesus with the lost.

How do we win one?

- The first and most important thing to do is _____.

 Consider all the people in your lives that are not yet saved. Make a list of your unsaved family members, friends, neighbors, classmates, and co-workers and pray regularly for each of them. Ask the Lord who specifically to speak to, how you should speak to them, and when. Pray for the boldness to speak because God will provide the opportunities.
- Realize that being saved ______ you to win one.

 Sharing your faith story does not require that you attend seminary. Believing in and receiving Christ qualifies you to be His witnesses. You don't have to know the whole Bible or speak eloquently to witness to people. All that is required is to speak of our experience in Christ. Even if you are a new Christian, you can testify, "I was empty and alone, but now Christ lives in me!" No one knows your story better than you... so share it
- Start by speaking to one person a _____.

 The best time to speak to others about Christ is immediately after you're born again, when your experience is fresh. But even if you've believed for a while and haven't developed a habit of witnessing, it's never too late to start. With any endeavor, practicing is important. (i.e., you can't expect to play baseball well if you never practice.) In the same way, you need to practice speaking. As you practice, you will learn how to reach different kinds of people, and your speaking will become more effective. Develop a 90 second testimony. You can do it! Have confidence and boldness to share your story of Jesus to everyone you meet!

Personal Commitment:

- A Commitment to Give We choose to be intentionally generous and gladly give of our resources to share Jesus with our community and the world. (2 Corinthians 9:6-8)
